(Updated 3-2-26)

Current IESA/IHSA rules apply, except as noted below

All NWCC By-Laws will be observed

2025/26 volleyball ref fees: \$50 per ref for multiple games; \$63 per ref if single game.

Conference Team Rules

1. Follow all OCS, IDPH, and Archdiocese Covid-19 guidelines.
2. No switching sides. An exception will be a gym such as QR that has an obvious serving side advantage. Switching sides will be allowed at this gym.
3. Procedure for canceling or postponing any given match.
 - a. All changes must be made through the athletic directors. Changes cannot be made within 48 hours unless cleared by the Executive Committee and/or VB assignor. If a match is canceled within 48 hours without permission, the canceling team will pay the officials for the canceled game(s).
 - b. Please notify the other team's AD/coach and then call **Jeff Schwarz** or email coachjeff1@aol.com
 - c. If the Executive Committee and/or the Volleyball Assignor are unaware of a schedule change, your team will be given a forfeit because the score was not called in.
4. A student-athlete may play up a grade but may not play down a grade, unless approved by Athletic Directors prior to the season.
5. **Every player dressed on the bench must play in a league game. If a team does not play all their players, they will forfeit the game. Playoffs are included.**
 - a. **At the 5th & 6th grade levels, effort should be given so that all players have equal playing time throughout the season.**
 - b. **At the 7th & 8th grade levels, playing time should reflect ability, effort, attendance at practices, and commitment to the team. However, playing time for all is expected at the 7th and 8th grade level. A reasonable guideline is for each athlete to play for the equivalent of at least one quarter (25%) of each game.**
 - c. If a dressed player is not playing due to a school rule/policy, it must be reported to the officials/score table/opposing coach prior to the game starting.
6. Every team must carry a roster of all team members and numbers. The head coach must have a roster available for the first game.
7. Scores should be reported to John Collins at 847-867-9502 or email nwccscores@comcast.net . Please report all 6th, 7th, and 8th grade scores.
REPORTING OF SCORES: Home team must report scores within 48 hours of the games.
Note: Failure to report scores in 48 hours will result in a Forfeit for the home team.
8. Referees should arrive **no later than 20 minutes** before game time.

9. Chanting and cheering is ***not allowed*** after the referee blows the whistle for the serve.

Conference Court Rules

1. Home team shall
 - a. Supply 2 good quality game balls, and clean balls between matches.
 - b. Supply a volley lite ball for 5th grade matches ONLY.**
 - c. Supply an official scorekeeper with a score sheet and time clock.
 - d. Have floor tape at the scorers table for the 25 ft serving line if you have 5th and 6th grade teams.
2. Padding on poles is required; no games can be played without padded poles or a referee stand.
- 3. Referee fee is \$50 per match. The home team pays the referee fee. Single matches will be \$63. Schools may use vouchers to pay referees.**
4. All referees should be paid prior to leaving the gym.
5. Warm ups: 3 minutes passing; 3 minutes home team hits; 3 minutes visiting team hits; 2 minutes both teams serving.
6. The serving line for 5th/6th grade teams is 25 ft (overhand or underhand).
Note: If an athlete is a strong overhand server, after 5 serves the athlete must serve behind the end line (5th/6th teams only).
Note: No athlete will have a CAP on the number of points they serve.
7. Unnecessary 3rd games can be played if time permits. All unnecessary 3rd games will be stopped 15 minutes before the next scheduled game. If there is no match following, there is no time constraint on the 3rd game. All unnecessary 3rd games are played to 25 points if time permits.
8. A team must start with at least 5 players or forfeit. When a team starts or is playing with fewer than 6 players, a point shall be awarded to the opponent each time the vacant position is in the right back/serving position. Ghost rule shall be used.
- 9. No CAP score.**

IHSA Game Rules

IHSA rules will apply unless otherwise noted

1. Rally scoring will be used
 - o 5th & 6th level: 2 out of 3 games to win. Win by 2. No cap score. 1st and 2nd set are to 25. **Necessary 3rd set will be to 15.**
 - o 7th & 8th level: 2 out of 3 games to win. Win by 2. No cap score. **All necessary sets are to 25.**
2. 2 timeouts per game. There is no 3rd timeout with rally score. Time outs do not carry over game to game. Timeouts will be full 60 seconds, even if the team who called the timeout is ready to begin play before 60 seconds. If both teams are ready to play before 60 seconds has run off, the game can begin at that time. An audible signal will sound at 45 seconds.
3. **STUD EARRING WILL BE ALLOWED**, but no other type of earring or any other jewelry can be worn. Soft barrettes/ribbons are legal.

4. The net height is 7 feet 4.25 inches for both girls and boys games for all grade levels.
5. Team rosters should be brought with coaches to the pregame meeting with the officials prior to match. Before each set, a written line up shall be submitted to the scorer. You may circle your first server. The first server of the game is the player in the right back position for the serving team. The first server of the game for the receiving team is the right front player. Coaches should submit their lineup in column form, with the first server being written on the top. Official(s) will penalize the offending team if the lineup on the court does not match the lineup at the score table.
6. Upon entering the gym, the home team selects the team bench/side. Visiting team calls a coin toss (serve or receive). If a third game is required, the home team calls the coin toss (serve or receive, or side if in an applicable gym). Coin tosses should be conducted in front of the table.
7. Let ball on serve is legal. Thus, a ball that hits the net and goes over is legal.
8. Proper game protocol will be used. Teams will start the match on the end lines and finish all games on the end lines.
9. Substitution Rules: Each team is allowed 18 subs per game. Starting the game does not count as a sub. Each player is allowed unlimited entries within the team limit. Subs should enter the sub zone one at a time. Other subs should wait just behind the 10 foot line.
10. Multiple contacts are allowed on any first ball over the net. This includes serves and during rallies. The IHSA rule 9-4-8 reads as follows:
 - Multiple contacts are more than one contact by a player during one attempt to play the ball. Multiple contacts are permitted only:
 - When the first ball over the net rebounds from one part of the player's body to one or more other legal parts in one attempt to block on any first team hit, whether the ball is touched by the block.
11. Players may legally contact the ball with any part of their body.
12. Players may not block a serve. The ball must go back over the net for it to be a completed block.
13. On the second team hit, the ball may contact various parts of the body consecutively, provided that the contacts occur during one action and the ball is next contacted by a teammate. If the ball completely crosses the net or is first touched by the opponent after multiple contacts on the second team hit, a double hit fault will be called. For example: if any court player sets the second ball (terms used- spins, comes out of the players hands ugly) and a third player makes contact, this is legal now. However, if the second contact is set over the net and/or the third contact is set over the net and in the judgement of the official they deem it to be multiple contacts this is a fault. If the second or third contact is deemed to be a lift or carry by any player, in the judgement of the official, it is a fault and sideout. This new rule has been enacted by the NCAA, NFHS and many other organizations to keep the spirit of the game moving along.

Volleyball Playoff Rules

(7th & 8th grade teams only)

- All teams must bring money for refs, the host school is not responsible for paying the refs; Schools are allowed to pay referees by vouchers.
Note: All schools paying by vouchers must have it filled out prior to the start of the game.
- Teams will pay the officials \$50 for all playoff matches (except the championship). If it ever turns out to be a single match, for whatever reason, it is an extra \$15.
- The host school will run the clock/scoreboard for all matches.
- The NWCC Finals are separate from the regular season standings.
- Matches will be the best 2 out of 3 games. **No 3rd game unless necessary.**
- 2 timeouts per game. Time outs do not carry over.
- The higher seeded team (i.e., lowest #) for each match must provide an adult to keep the book. They will also be considered the home team.

Current NWCC rules should be followed for playoffs unless noted below.

1. NWCC will pay the officials for the championship games.
2. Two officials will be used for all playoff games. Two officials will be used for the championship as well.
3. **Team rosters need to be brought with coaches to the pregame meeting with the officials. Lineups should be at the score table 2 minutes before the match starts and 1 minute between games. Official(s) will penalize the offending team if the lineup on the court does not match the lineup at the score table.**
4. Games are not guaranteed to start on the hour. Teams need to be ready to play ½ hour before the scheduled time.
5. Winners of the first matches may play a second time the same night.
6. Conduct the coin toss immediately after the previous match and start the warm-ups right after the toss.
7. The home team will be the team with the better seed (i.e., the lower #).
8. The home team chooses the bench for the first game and the visiting team calls the toss.
9. If a third game is necessary, the home team calls the toss.
10. There will be individual trophies given for 1st and 2nd place for end of regular season standings for 7th & 8th grade level teams.
11. The traveling trophy will be awarded to the winning team of the championship game. Medals will be awarded to both teams playing in the championship game.

Appendix A: Substitution Rules

In a set, it is legal for multiple players to be subbed into a single numbered spot in the serving order, so long as they are subbed into only that numbered spot. For example:

Serve order:	Starters:	Substitutions made:
1	Danny	Zac
2	Nick	Kyle, Isaiah
3	Ethan	Ryan, Rian, Anthony, Danny ← illegal substitution, because Danny started in the 1 spot.
4	Charlie	
5	Eric	Franciz
6	Jack	Ryan ← illegal substitution, because Ryan already subbed into the 3 spot.

Any or all of the subs can sub in for **Danny** in this set, but once they go in for **Danny** they can not sub in for another spot in the serve order. So, as **Zac** is subbing in to spot **1**, he can not sub in to the **2, 3, 4, 5, or 6** spot later during this set.

Likewise, if any of the starters are subbed out, they can only be subbed back into their original position in the serve order. The starters in a set can not sub for each other in that same set.

All starting positions and substitutions are reset at the beginning of each set.
